- October 11 event held at the Korean Seventh-day Adventist Church in Loma Linda attracted more than 300 attendees, with mistress of ceremonies Martha
- The evening kicked off with a social and shopping hour, featuring local vendors offering giftable wares ranging from artwork, kitchen gadgets, artisan treats, and holiday decor, while local musical group "Swingstreet" played big band and jazz favorites
- Attendees tasted 22 savory and sweet bites for home entertaining, with recipe cards provided to wow guests at their own parties
- Donald Moores, MD, Chief of Pediatric Surgery at Loma Linda University Children's Hospital, shared the patient story of Veer Jaine's miraculous recovery from a near drowning.
- Nurses from Loma Linda University Children's Hospital volunteered as the Kitchen Crew, trading in their scrubs for aprons to cook and prep the appetizers for service
- More than 30 uniformed San Bernardino County sheriffs and Riverside police officers, along with a United States Army captain, served guests, assisted with the live auction, and earned more than **\$2,300** in tips added to the evening's proceeds
- Teen Challenge members from Benedict Castle in Riverside enthusiastically greeted attendees, bussed tables, and cleaned up after the event

HOLIDAY SPARKLE

The **Trees of Hope** campaign was adopted by the Big Hearts for Little Hearts Loma Linda Guild in 2000, as one of the guild's first—and most enduring—projects. Designed as a fundraiser for Loma Linda University Children's Hospital, the trees also provide a focal point of beauty, peace, and hope in the hospital lobby during the Christmas season.

Every fall, the guild mails out invitations to former patients, donors, guild members, and others, inviting them to make a donation to Loma Linda University Children's Hospital and to place angels on the trees.

The gift amount determines the type of angel placed on the tree and donors have the option to tag the angel in honor or memory of someone special. The angels are hung on the trees throughout the month of December. If requested by the donor, the angel will be sent to the person of their choice in January.

The festive project has proven to be a grand success, with the number of trees needed to hold all the angels increasing through the years—in 2023, we decorated four trees with angels!

The guild is delighted to share that since 2000, nearly \$500,000 has been donated to the Loma Linda University Children's Hospital through the Trees of Hope campaign—thank you from our hearts to yours.
