



Underrepresented in Medicine Visiting Student Pediatric Rotation

GOALS

Provide non-LLU senior medical students from backgrounds traditionally underrepresented in medicine an opportunity to work alongside our LLU Pediatric faculty and residents while increasing their knowledge of acute care and ambulatory pediatrics. Students will be exposed to the diverse patient population of our community, along with the broad range of medical conditions and healthcare disparities at LLUCH and RUHS.

OBJECTIVES

- a. Understand the continuum of care for children with acute illness/injury, from initial presentation in the ER through acute hospital care to discharge planning.
- b. Understand how to assess and manage common signs and symptoms associated with acute illness and hospitalization.
- c. Understand how to assess and manage common childhood conditions cared for in the inpatient setting.
- d. Understand the indications, limitations, and interpretation of common laboratory tests and imaging studies utilized in inpatient care.
- e. Develop a logical and appropriate clinical approach to the care of hospitalized children, applying decision-making and problem-solving principles.
- f. Understand how to function as part of an interdisciplinary team on a general pediatric ward, as the primary provider, and as the consulting pediatrician.
- g. Understand how to provide sensitive support acutely to patients and families of children with acute illness and arrange for ongoing support and/or preventive services at discharge.
- h. Understand key aspects of high-value care in the hospital inpatient setting.
- i. Explore issues of health disparities and social determinants of health.
- j. Experience small group sessions in preparation for interview season.





Underrepresented in Medicine Funded Visiting Pediatric Rotation

This elective is designed to give students an inside look at our Pediatric residency program. To know us is to love us! The 4-week rotation will include either inpatient rounding or 4 weeks of mixed inpatient and outpatient pediatrics exposure.

To be considered, an applicant must:

- Be in the final year of their medical training
- Have completed their core clerkship in Pediatrics
- Plan to apply for residency positions in Pediatrics
- Attend an LCME or AOA-accredited medical school
- Be a U.S. citizen, Canadian citizen, or permanent resident of the United States
- Identify as belonging to a population that is underrepresented in medicine (as defined by the AAMC)

If you would like to rotate at RUHS, please just complete this application with no need to complete VSLO.
